SC State closing buildings to save

South Carolina State University's interim president says the school is closing nine aging buildings to save money. The Times and Democrat of Orangeburg reports that Franklin Evans told trustees Thursday that all the buildings are heated by an old, inefficient boiler system and some have other problems. The buildings include four dorms and the I P Stanback Museum and Planetarium. Evans says all the items in the museum will be moved to a different building. University officials say the university could save up to \$1.7 million a year closing the buildings. Trustees said Thursday they have also changed Evans' title from "acting president" to "interim president" as a vote of confidence in the job he is doing. — AP

Deputies: Man shot wife, 2 others, himself

Investigators say a husband shot his wife, her son and the son's girlfriend before killing himself in their South Carolina home. York County deputies released more details about the July 5 killings, including that 50-year-old Randy Moore used his wife's gun in the shootings. He had been convicted of bank fraud and drug charges in federal court and couldn't own a gun. Authorities say it appears Moore shot and killed 31-year-old Jason Lockamy and his 31-year-old girlfriend Lora Young before going back in the Rock Hill house and killing his 50-year-old wife Assistant York County Manager Anna Moore. Deputies say they still don't know why Randy Moore decided to kill the three people. Authorities say the bodies were discovered by a family friend invited over for a cookout. — AP

Body of woman found at scene of wreck

Sheriff's deputies in Horry County say the body of a woman dressed only in underwear was found in the passenger seat of a car. Deputy Coroner Michelle McSpadden told local media outlets that the body of 45-year-old Mary Catherine Polk was found Friday morning. McSpadden said Polk died from injuries sustained in the crash. Horry County Police spokesman L.L. Raul Denis said the driver of the car was nowhere to be found after the accident. Police searched the area with tracking dogs. Although the incident is being treated as a traffic fatality, Denis said that status could change when the cause of the woman's death is determined. — AP
